## Sports Program – Melbourne 2026

The introduction and expansion of new sports reflect the continued growth of the Games and our commitment to providing inclusive opportunities across all age groups, genders, and skill levels. Enhancements to this years competition include:

- Improved online scheduling and event structuring to manage increased participation and ensure athlete welfare
- Progress toward alignment with Athletics Australia and state bodies, supporting pathways, recognition, and future funding opportunities
- Expansion of junior and community participation opportunities
- Introduction of new sports such as Kho Kho and competitive Gatka
- Strengthening of women's engagement programs and facilities
- Improved digital systems for fixtures, results, and event management
- A continued focus on delivering a professional sporting environment, while maintaining the community spirit of the Games
- Exhibition games with Silh V1 against strong state level teams

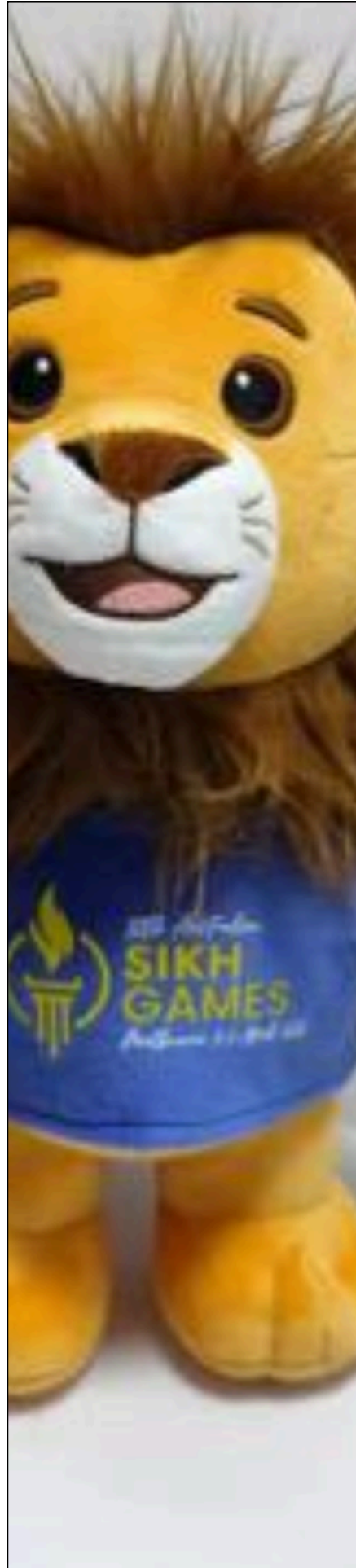

# THE MELBOURNE SIKH GAMES



## The numbers:

- 9,000+ expected athletes
- One of the largest community-led sporting events in Australia

# SHUTTLE BUS

To assist with smooth transport across venues, the Melbourne Sikh Games 2026 will operate a dedicated shuttle service featuring two routes and nine buses continuously circulating throughout the Games precinct. This service has been designed to minimise walking distances, reduce congestion, and ensure efficient movement for athletes, officials, volunteers, and spectators between competition sites.

The image below outlines the planned routes for both shuttle lines, linking all venues and facilities together in a continuous loop system. It is anticipated that a shuttle bus will arrive approximately every three to five minutes, ensuring a consistent and reliable flow of transport throughout the day and allowing seamless connectivity between sports and central activity areas.

# CELLULAR ON WHEELS

To ensure uninterrupted digital operations throughout the Melbourne Sikh Games 2026, Telstra will be sponsoring a Cellular on Wheels (COW) installation at the event site to boost network capacity and coverage. This temporary mobile telecommunications tower will help prevent connectivity dropouts during peak usage periods, supporting live scoring, streaming, media coverage, and seamless communication across all venues during the Games.



# GAMES CEREMONY

The official Games Ceremony for the Melbourne Sikh Games 2026 will take place at the State Netball Hockey Centre on Field One, and all competitions across the site will temporarily pause to allow athletes and spectators to participate in this important occasion. The ceremony will celebrate unity, sporting excellence, and community pride, marking the formal commencement of the Games. All athletes are required to assemble on Field Two at 4:30 PM for the official march past before proceeding onto Field One for the ceremony. Attendance is compulsory for participating teams unless otherwise approved by the Organising Committee.

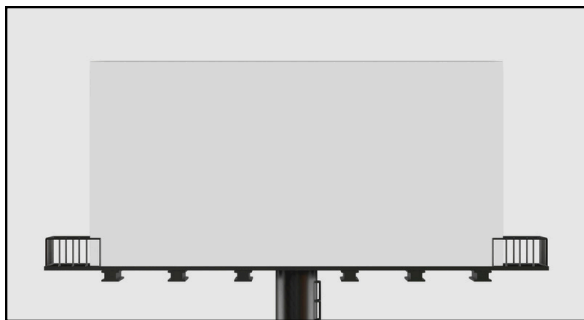
# ICE MACHINE

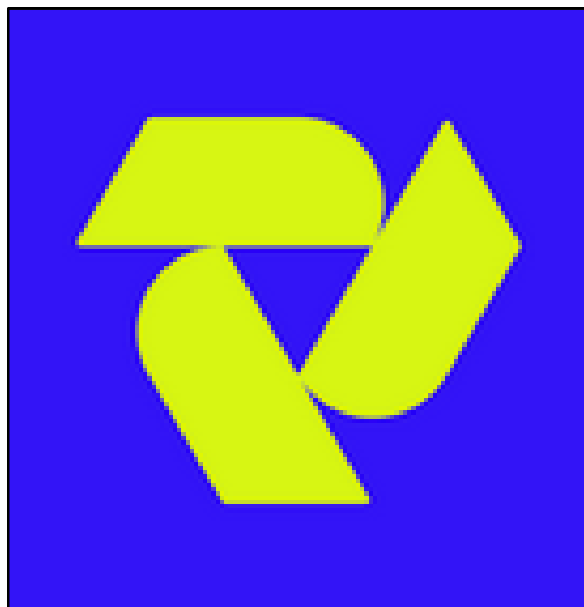

# LANGAR

Langar services will be available throughout the Australian Sikh Games Melbourne 2026, ensuring participants, volunteers, and spectators have access to meals in line with Sikh traditions of community service and inclusivity.

To support the scale of the event and the distribution of venues across the precinct, Langar will be centrally located at two key service points:

- Red Route – Bus Stop 1
- Blue Route – Bus Stop 2

These locations have been strategically positioned to service the eastern and western precincts of the Games, ensuring accessibility for all attendees across the various sporting venues.

Participants are encouraged to utilise the shuttle bus network to access Langar services efficiently between venues.

Where required and subject to coordination, Langar may be delivered to specific venues in consultation with the Langar Coordinators. Teams or groups seeking this option should engage directly with the relevant coordinators in advance to discuss feasibility and logistics.

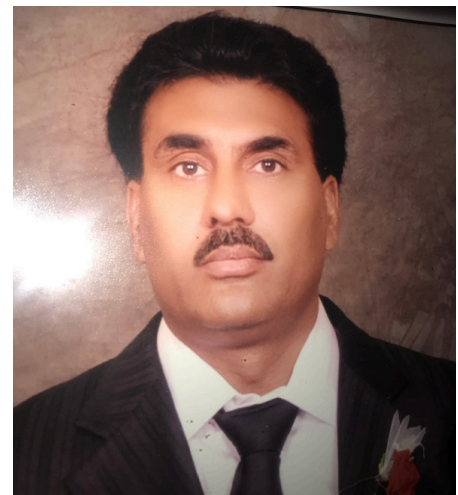

# ATHLETICS EVENT OVERVIEW

Athletics at the Australian Sikh Games Melbourne 2026 continues to set new benchmarks, showcasing exceptional talent across a broad range of age groups and disciplines. The delivery of this year's program reflects a significant level of planning and coordination, and we acknowledge the outstanding efforts of the Athletics Lead and organising team in developing a structured, inclusive, and professionally managed competition.

This year marks record participation, making it one of the largest athletics carnivals ever conducted at the Sikh Games. The strong level of engagement across both track and field events highlights the continued growth of athletics within the community and the increasing demand for high-quality competition. With athletes travelling from across Australia and internationally, the event is set to deliver a competitive and engaging experience for both participants and spectators.

## Venues and Competition Dates

- Friday, 3 April 2026
- Field events will be conducted at Essendon Little Athletics Track.
- Saturday, 4 April and Sunday, 5 April 2026
- Track and field events will take place at the Melbourne University Athletics Track.

Melbourne University will serve as the primary athletics venue for the weekend and is accessible via Bus Stop 4 on the Blue Route.

## Transport and Parking

Participants and spectators are encouraged to utilise parking facilities at Melbourne University, where approximately 600 car spaces are available. Attendees travelling to Essendon on Friday should allow additional time for travel and parking.

# Basketball

Basketball at the Australian Sikh Games Melbourne 2026 has recorded the largest number of entries in the history of the Games, reflecting the rapid growth and increasing popularity of the sport within the community. This year's competition will deliver a high-quality, fast-paced tournament, showcasing talent across multiple divisions in a professionally managed environment.

The competition will be staged at the State Netball and Hockey Centre, a premier indoor venue capable of supporting a large-scale event and providing an excellent experience for both players and spectators.

Venues and Competition Dates (Stadium will be opened at 7:30AM for an 8AM start)

- Friday, 3 April 2026
- Matches will be played across Courts 8, 9, 10, and 11
- Saturday, 4 April 2026
- Matches will expand across Courts 3, 4, 5, 8, 9, 10, and 11
- Finals
- All finals will be played on Courts 10 and 11, creating a centralised championship setting for the concluding matches and medal presentations.

The venue is serviced by both Red Bus Route 1 and Blue Bus Route 4, depending on the event schedule and access points.

#### Transport and Parking

Due to the State Netball and Hockey Centre serving as a central hub for multiple sports, car parking will be extremely limited. The area surrounding Bus Route 1 is expected to reach capacity early, and significant congestion is anticipated throughout the day.

All participants and spectators are strongly encouraged to utilise public transport and the official shuttle bus services to access the venue. The shuttle network has been designed to provide efficient movement across the precinct and minimise delays.

Planning your journey in advance and allowing additional travel time is highly recommended to ensure timely arrival for matches.

All fixtures, results, and standings will be managed through the official Games digital platform, ensuring real-time updates and transparency throughout the competition.
